Starfinder Summer Camps: Success!

Senior Leaders Serve Starfinder Youth

As our Senior Leaders come back to Starfinder for fall programs, ten return with memories of a dream summer job.

Most of our teen coaches get their first jobs with Starfinder, staffing our summer programs and putting everything they've learned at Starfinder into practice. By serving in a position of leadership on the field, our teens learn responsibility, professional standards of behavior, and how to be a role

model.



"The coaches know how to be silly, and the kids laughed their heads off," said Katharine Cunningham, our summer program coordinator. "They loved having all these young coaches that loved playing with them."

"My favorite part about summer camp was getting to teach and interact with the kids, getting to know them," said Yennie (pictured), who added that the kids' spirit

helped her achieve her own goals. "They influenced me to try out for my own high school team, which is something I regret not doing earlier."

Coaches thrived as they put their training at Starfinder into action on the field and learned lessons they will take to their next jobs and beyond.

"When you're energetic, the kids are energetic," said Makihra (age 16). "You have to be energetic to get the job done. You have to show appreciation and have fun."

"Our coaches will leave knowing that they can successfully be a leader, and a mature young adult," said Katharine.



Kids Work Hard, Get Their Voices Heard

Six communities of "rock star" kids had access to great soccer and enrichment programs this summer!

Starfinder partnered with Helping Hand Rescue Mission, Kensington Soccer Club, Education Works, Episcopal Community Services, and Germantown Soccer Club to run six community sites for 232 kids.



Campers came from all levels of soccer experience, but coaches made them feel recognized and appreciated for their hard work.

We sent 16 of our teens to Gothenburg, Sweden for the Gothia Cup, the world's largest youth soccer tournament! Sponsored by SKF USA, our team (and three of our program coaches) got to go on the trip of a lifetime, see a new country and play soccer with kids from all over the world.



"You can't help but notice the unbelievable diversity there," said Katharine Cunningham, leader of the trip. "We were sitting next to a group of boys from India, and in front of a girls team from Cambodia, and behind a team from Sierra Leone. It's like being at the Olympics but for kids."

Team Starfinder loved the chance to play soccer with new groups of people. And they were impressed at how much they learned.

"I can see huge changes, not only in my body but also in

character and personality," said Matt (age 16). "I learned to be physically and mentally educated and prepared for intense situations, and how to be a more open person, something I've struggled with in the past. Leading activities and taking initiative was just something I wouldn't have done before this trip."

On June 10th, we celebrated the high school graduation of 22 Senior Leaders. Most are now in college, while others are pursuing jobs or entering the military.

As our teens went from "Senior Leaders" to "Starfinder Alumni," we took a moment to look back on their time with us and look forward to their future.

"When they were announcing everyone's names, I realized I've been with these guys for four years, and now we're all going separate ways," said David Madrid, who is now studying biology at Arcadia University and plans to become a doctor. "I didn't want [my time at Starfinder] to end, and it felt like yesterday was my first day. Now that I look back, I miss it, but I know I needed to make room for younger people."

Some of our students received extra help with their education this year: thanks to a generous donor, this is the second year that Starfinder has been able to provide \$1,000 scholarships to students, and we were able to increase the number of recipients from two to five.

We can't wait to see what our graduates do next!

Where Are They Now?

Mykola Lyakhovolsky Is Working At Starfinder!

Before he graduated from the Senior Leader Program in 2013, Ukrainian- born Mykola Lyakhovolsky used to take three buses from his high school in Northeast Philadelphia to get to Starfinder. Mykola, now 19 and a sophomore at Penn State Abington, recently joined the Starfinder staff for a year of service with Coach Across America. We asked him to reflect on his time at Starfinder.

What are you up to now?

I'm a sophomore at Penn State Abington studying criminal justice. At school I'm a member of THON, an organization that raises money for childhood cancer, and Vice President of the Criminal Justice Association. I'm also a Coach Across America coach here at Starfinder. I'm recruiting students to join the Starfinder program, and when I go to schools and see kids excited about the program, I get really excited too.

What are some big things that changed after you graduated high school?

I realized I can't mess around at college. In high school I treated everything like a joke but now I have to take my college courses seriously. I also realized you get a lot more freedom at college, like you can leave in between classes, but you just have to manage time better.

Do you feel like the lessons you learned at Starfinder are helping you now?

My time at Starfinder really helped me to transition to college. I learned to be outgoing to meet new people and build relationships. I'm now Vice President of a club at college because I have the confidence to speak up instead of sit in the shadows.

Do you have any advice for kids currently at Starfinder?

Starfinder is offering more opportunities and you should take advantage of all of them. Some kids don't take it seriously enough. You never know your limits: be at your full potential whether it's getting extra tutoring or pushing yourself during soccer drills.
