The ongoing focus on unemployment and job creation is topic number one in the national political debate. Here at Starfinder we also know first-hand the impact that a paying job has on our Senior Leader participants. For the past two summers, we have created paid internships for over 20 of our most committed participants. In previous newsletters we have included written reflections from the Senior Leader interns that highlight the meaningfulness of the work experience. For most, this is the first paycheck that they have ever received. We have seen in all of our interns how the tasks and requirements of the paid summer experience are instrumental in the development of new levels of awareness, accountability, and responsibility that comes with having a job.

We are ecstatic to announce a new partnership with **The Hill at Whitemarsh**, a continuing care retirement community located in Lafayette Hill. Through an introduction from Starfinder supporter Richard Lowe, conversations began last spring between **Judy McGruther**, CEO at The Hill, and me about how our two organizations might work together. Today, two Starfinder graduates, **Luc Toussaint** and **Mohammed Bah** (both at Delaware County Community College), and four Senior Leaders, **Mike Arthur** and siblings **Nury, Sammy**, and **Danny Ortiz** are working as part-time

food service employees at The Hill. Each day brings many opportunities for learning and growth as these young people navigate the responsibilities of being part of the world

We are hopeful that 3 or 4 additional Starfinder youth will join the food service ranks in the coming weeks. Looking to the future, Judy and I envision other work opportunities in facility maintenance, landscaping, and possibly health services. We are also very excited about the possibilities for intergenerational programming where

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# **Program News**

### **Eat Right, Get Fit, Grow Strong!**

Fitness and nutrition education is essential to the health and learning of children and adolescents. The fitness and nutrition behaviors of young people have a direct impact on their long-term social, emotional, psychological, and intellectual development. Research indicates that health education as part of an after school program enables young people to develop the knowledge and skills that they



need to avoid health risks and enhance both their health and their ongoing social and academic achievement.

Health and nutrition education has always been part of the Starfinder curriculum. We are pleased to announce that grants from the **Walmart Foundation** and **Janssen Biotech** will enable us to significantly enhance our **Eat Right, Get Fit, Grow Strong** health and nutrition program. Starfinder's Future and Junior Leader participants will be involved in hands-on classroom activities that introduce, develop, and extend knowledge and understanding about proper nutrition, healthy food choices, food science, food preparation, and the relationship between nutrition and health. A key element of this enhanced program is Starfinder's provision of a nutritious snack to each attendee at each session and the distribution of an environmentally appropriate water container for every participant. Through this program we will provide our participants with the knowledge and skills they need to not only enhance their personal health, but also the health of their families and communities.

As part of this grant Starfinder has purchased 3 treadmills, 2 elliptical trainers, and 2 recumbent bicycles that will be used to supplement our ongoing soccer cardio fitness activities. Additionally, these fitness machines will be available to the parents of our participants so that they can get in some exercise while they are here watching their children participate in the Starfinder program. What a great opportunity for the whole family to learn about the benefits of eating right, getting fit, and growing strong.

# Junior and Senior Boys Showcase Their Soccer Skills

Starfinder's participants are no different than the thousands of soccer players throughout the country who have aspirations of playing college soccer. What is sometimes different is that many of our participants do not get the opportunity to play in front of college coaches. On Saturday, January 7, 2012, Starfinder held its first ever **College Showcase**. Thirty-eight Senior Leaders participated in a series of games to showcase their talents to over fifteen college coaches from the Philadelphia area. It proved to be an incredible experience for all who attended.

Rob Nydick, coach at Arcadia University, shared this comment.

"The Starfinder College Showcase was a very beneficial recruiting event for our program. The showcase provided us with an opportunity to identify many players who would be a great addition to our University and soccer program."

Starfinder participants were equally excited to get the opportunity to "showcase" their skills for the attending coaches. The team play was competitive and skillful with great spirit evident in every match. Here is what some Starfinder Senior Leaders had to say about the tournament.

Hailing from Philadelphia's Olney section, where pathways to a positive future are ridden with drugs, crime and other deleterious behaviors, Rosy sets her sights on college. While waiting to receive college acceptance letters, Rosy



is focusing her efforts on relieving the financial burden of college by applying for financial aid, grants and other scholarships. She expects to find out in March if her first choice, West Chester University, becomes a reality.

With classmates struggling to finish high school as young mothers and fathers, "education first" resonates as Rosy reflects on her involvement over the years with Starfinder. Working as a Starfinder Summer Intern in 2011 helped her realize the impact she can have on young kids. "I want to major in Business Management so I can create a soccer program (like Starfinder) for kids." Rosy never saw herself as a role model until she learned that playing games like Duck, Duck, Goose, giving high fives, and demonstrating her soccer ball skills brought smiles to young faces and created a connection with the aspiring soccer players in her neighborhood.

Rosy is blessed to have a great role model in her own home – her Mom! Each morning at 4:30, Rosy's Mom rises to do household chores and make preparations for breakfast, lunch, and dinner and then heads off to her full time job. Rosy marvels at her Mom's energy and dedication and is inspired by her parents whose devotion and love encourages her to do the best she can in all her endeavors.

Once again this summer, SKF USA Inc., whose North American headquarters is located in Lansdale, will sponsor a team from Starfinder to participate in the Gothia Cup, the world's largest youth soccer tournament. The team of seventeen U18 boys and 3 coaches will travel to Gothenburg, Sweden from July 14-22 for games against teams from around the world.

Last summer, a team of U16 Starfinder players had the experience of a lifetime as they competed against teams from England, Guatemala, Norway, and Sweden, met young people from Africa and Asia, and learned a lot about themselves as they enjoyed the culture and history of a foreign country. This summer's participants, none of whom participated in 2011, will be selected based on their program attendance, engagement with enrichment activities, behavior in all interactions, improvement and performance in soccer activities, and written responses to two essay questions.

SKF will also sponsor an indoor tournament in March for all Senior Leader boys and once the Gothia Cup team is chosen, a number

of outdoor scrimmages will be scheduled in May and June to prepare for the tournament in Sweden. Many thanks once again to SKF USA Inc. for their belief in the Starfinder program and their commitment to provide such a special opportunity.
