












Starfinder's Senior Leaders Program is an intensive seven-month program for high school students that combines high quality soccer training with academic support, mentoring, and leadership development.

## **Youth Council Leads The Way**

In January Senior Leaders started taking the lead in a whole new way when Starfinder formed its first ever Youth Council.

"It's an awesome leadership opportunity for me and other Senior Leaders to give our input about the program and to contribute our own ideas and additions we would like to include in the program." said Katerina (age 18). "Youth Council allows us to be innovative and allows us to feel like we are working towards something greater than ourselves."



Every Friday, a group of 13 committed teens meets to discuss different aspects of the Senior Leader program, provide feedback to coaches, and participate in important decisions.

These teens have already made positive changes. The Youth Council expressed concern about the attendance policy and how those playing spring sports would be affected. With the coaches, the Youth Council created a new policy to allow teens to play spring sports without negatively affecting their attendance. The group has also organized an International Day Event and is currently working on tournaments and planning for graduation.

"We can't just preach about leadership, we have to give youth the opportunity to lead," said Jeanette Hibbs, Program Director. "The Youth Council bridges the gap between Senior Leaders and staff; it gives them a voice."

Jeanette added that most of the participants save up for items with the Starfinder logo. "The kids want Starfinder stuff. The name really means something to them. They want to represent Starfinder."

"They can't buy that stuff with money," added Mykola Lyakhovolsky, program graduate and current Starfinder coach. "The only way they can get the Starfinder gear is by earning it."

Farid (age 18) traded points for a water bottle specifically because of the Starfinder logo. "I bring it whenever I'm out with friends, so they ask me about Starfinder and I get to talk about it."
