On June 12th, 2013, we celebrated the graduation of our 28 high school seniors from our program as well as from their high schools. For the 6th year in a row, 100% of Starfinder's regularly-attending seniors completed high school. And all of them have either been accepted into or have plans to pursue college.

Thanks to generous sponsorship support (see below), for the first time this year Starfinder was able to provide \$1,000 scholarships to two of its collegebound young leaders. Selena Mercado and Amadou Sow earned this award through their outstanding commitment to Starfinder and its values.

She told them, if you want to buy a car, you need a plan, to stick with it, implement it, and make good choices in handling finances. These things apply to anything you do in life.

She helped with summer camp registration, talked to parents, and got to see how excited the campers were.

Lastly, Vicky helped launch Starfinder's Alumni Association, which will enable graduates and past participants to stay in touch with Starfinder and connect them to new opportunities. Vicky plans to stay involved with Starfinder as a volunteer, especially with the Alumni Group.

After working with the Senior Leaders in the classroom, at the summer camps, and in developing the Alumni Association, she built strong relationships.

Camp Teaches Kids and Coaches

Just another day in the Starfinder Summer Camps.

Our soccer and education summer camps are going strong. By the end of the summer nearly 300 youth, most of whom live in underserved communities throughout the City, will have had a chance to participate. In addition to soccer skills and team building games, campers are learning about eating healthy and working together, all while having fun.

And it's not just the campers who are getting a great experience. Ten teens from our Senior Leaders program are working hard as camp coaches and learning a lot about what it takes to be a great leader.

For Cyd Marie, who is more comfortable in her native Spanish, coaching is forcing her to use English more and increasing her confidence with the language. "I'm learning that I have to try to talk and not be shy," Cyd Marie said. "When I try to tell the kids something and I get stuck, I ask the other coaches who speak Spanish and they tell me how to say it in English."

Erick is learning about how to work with children from all different backgrounds and help them succeed on the field. "The biggest challenge is the variety of kids and their personalities and learning how to cope with each one individually," Erick said. "The best part is when you see change in the kids when a kid doesn't want to play at the beginning, but at the end he's happy and really involved."

Starfinder is pleased to announce a new partnership with the Alliance for a Healthier Generation, a national organization founded by the American Heart Association and Clinton Foundation whose goal is to reduce the prevalence of childhood obesity and to empower kids to develop lifelong, healthy habits. The Alliance empowers the people who influence kids by providing access to educational resources and science-based best practices.

This summer we are piloting a health and nutrition curriculum from

the Alliance, which we aim to use in our year-round programs. One aspect of the new curriculum is called EmpowerMe and emphasizes youth facilitating lessons for other youth.

There's a lot of work to do before any of these ideas can become reality, but we are inspired by the possibilities!

And our participants got inspired, too. During the winter, fifteen Senior Leaders got to work with architects from the Architecture in Education program to create their own visions for the building. The 8-week course taught them basic architectural concepts and gave them a chance to dream big. Their models were on display during our Graduation Celebration in June.
